

RETIRED AFTER A CAREER WITH 29 WINS!

IN THE PINK!

LONGRUN WAS THRILLED TO WELCOME

2017 Canadian Horse of the Year and seven time Sovereign Award winning sprinter, Entourage Stable's Pink Lloyd, to our fold last fall. "Pinkie" thrilled his many fans by winning his last career start, the G2 Kennedy Road Stakes, on November 27th and then travelled to Hillsburgh after spending some letdown time at the Woodbine barn of his trainer, Bob Tiller. His remarkable career spanned six seasons and 38 starts, with 29 victories (26 of them stakes) and a bankroll of \$1,884,584 U.S.

Pink Lloyd has adjusted well to retired life, having first been on turnout by himself and then joining two other notable retirees, 2015 Canadian champion two-year-old Riker and stakes winner

Doug was an accomplished international show jumper being the chef d'equipe when Canada won Olympic gold in Mexico in 1968. In his later life, Doug combined his horse and manufacturing experience with his partner Karen Breitbach's business background to

BOB HARVEY 1938-2021

Bob, a native of Sudbury, ON, was successful entrepreneur who established Cooksville Tire allowing him time to pursue his true passion for horse racing and eventually breeding. A winner of two Sovereign Awards his proudest moment was when his horse Numerous Times, trained by Sid Attard, won the 2001 G1 Atto Mile by a nose in track record time.

FRANCES OLWEN WHITE 1965-2021

Frances was a huge lover of animals owning many cats and dogs and had a lifelong passion for horses. Being the daughter of Gretchen Ross and step-daughter of Donald Ross, a long-time thoroughbred racehorse owner, she had ample opportunities to enjoy horses and horse racing.

NEIL'S DIAMOND

EVERY YEAR, approximately 500 Thoroughbreds arrive in Puerto Rico and surrounding islands from Canada and the U.S. to race, but when these horses are ready to retire, there are few rehoming opportunities for them. Fortunately, Caribbean Thoroughbred Aftercare, a fellow organization accredited by the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, helps transition many of these horses back to the mainland and into loving homes.

Last year, Franz and Danielle Crean, a couple who have been a part of our racing community for many years, asked LongRun if there was a way to keep an eye out for their homebred Neil's Diamond, a 2013 gelding by Where's the Ring who had successfully campaigned at both Woodbine and Fort Erie

before being claimed away and ending up in Puerto Rico in 2019. We contacted C.T.A. co-founder and executive director, Kelley Stobie, who in turn spoke with Neil's owner, Carlos Casillas. Carlos and his son had developed a very strong attachment to their stellar performer, who won 12 times for them, and agreed that the time was right, retiring him after his final start, a winning one on February 5 of this year, with the understanding that Neil would return to Canada to live out his life with his breeders.

LongRun is so grateful to Kelley, who has worked tirelessly to facilitate Neil's journey, arranging travel documents, quarantine, air and land transportation and layovers. He is finally back in Ontario, where he will spend a bit of time with us before he reunites with the Creans. Mr. Casillas also played a big role in this happy story and has indicated that he would like to come to Canada and visit

PITCHING FAST

Heading home in the opposite direction will be 5-yearold Pitching Fast, a chestnut son of Munnings out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Waynetta. He was sold to Up Hill Stables by his Kentucky breeders Kevin Reynolds, Kellie Holland & Tim Holland at the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

He started his brief career with two races at Turfway at the end of 2019 and then went into the care of trainer Rachel Halden, a regular conditioner at Woodbine. Walter, named after famed pitcher Walter Johnson, ran only four times at Woodbine winning his final two starts and earning \$52,314. Being a barn favourite, Rachel wanted to ensure this lovely horse had a happy retirement, so LongRun was contacted and Walter came to the farm in December, 2021 to start his rehabilitation.



Walter will be returning to his Lexington roots to continue his recuperation.

Recently we received a call from Walter's breeder Kevin Reynolds who had heard LongRun had the horse and through Rachel, got our phone number. He wanted to adopt the horse for his 28-year-old daughter Hannah and bring him back to their Lexington farm. We received a detailed adoption application from Hannah who was then contacted by LongRun Farm Manager Lauren Millet-Simpson who wanted to ensure the Reynolds understood the stage Walter was at in his rehab and how much more time was needed for a complete recovery. Satisfied that they understood Walter's needs and had the facility to provide complete care, it sounded like a perfect adoption. Walter will receive his next veterinarian visit at the end of May. Once it is determined where his recovery stands, Walter will be heading back to his "old Kentucky home" to start his new career.
