This year Mike has won an Open Intermediate in Florida, had three other top three finishes including in a Three Star event, and enjoyed success in 1.2 meter jumpers! And Jim's other OTTB, Wabbit, has had a terrific campaign this year as well.

Jessica Phoenix also has a connection with LongRun through graduate War Buckaroo and other LR retirees. Jessica tells us "Thoroughbred horses have always been close to my heart. I started my international competitive career aboard two ex-racehorses, Exploring and Expotential (War Buckaroo). These geldings took me to the highest level of sport, including multiple 5* competitions, Olympics, World Equestrian Games and Pan American Games. The heart and athletic ability of a thoroughbred is unrivaled and unmatched and will always be a staple in my competitive program".

No, she was there to offer me the position of Executive Administrator for LongRun. A visit to the humble office over the backstretch kitchen was enough for me to start my eight-and-one-half year journey with LongRun.

There have been highs, lows, frustrations and a lot of paperwork. I've talked with people excited about adopting a thoroughbred and others who have sad stories of losing a dear pet and partner. I spent a couple of months in 2016 practicing working from home due to a fractured femur when a horse fell on me. I was often on the phone with a foster farm operator or potential adopter while doing my physiotherapy. It was during this time LongRun finally found the perfect farm in Hillsburgh, ON. I first saw it while being pushed in a wheelchair by my husband; a beautiful, serene 100 acres that had so much potential to consolidate our operation and offer even more horses a chance for a dignified retirement. After much discussion by our committed board and with a generous bequest from Lana Hershelle Sniderman, it was ours.

Now, six years later, I am proud to say I have been

I've had long days and nights worrying about sick horses, trying to complete endless pages of grant applications and keeping up with the needs of a busy charity. I got to work with an amazing staff on the farm, have proudly shown off the property to many visitors and fallen in love with many of our horses, both sanctuary and those just passing through. But now it's time to pull on the reins and ease my workload. I've spent almost 50 years involved in the thoroughbred racing industry and now want to spend some time with my family, friends and do some of those things I've put aside for so many years. I will miss LongRun greatly but plan on still helping with events and volunteering. As everyone I've worked with knows, you can never totally leave the horses."

A WELCOME VISIT FROM COPS AND KIDS!
